WHAT HAPPENED LAST MONTH
MINUTES FROM Jan. 11, 2022 ZOOM MEETING

CLVN President, Diann Marsalek, called the zoom meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. CLVN will be holding Zoom Meetings until further notice of when it is safe to have in person meetings. Officers in attendance: Terry Diamond-Vice President, Jim Kink-Treasurer, Mary Anderson-Corresponding Secretary and Area Directors Dorothy Klees, Dorothy Mroski and Charley Wilcox. Excused officer was Area Director- Sharon Williams. A quorum was present.

Congressman Quigley Report: Yoni Pizer gave a report for the Congressman. The level of crime is disturbing and unacceptable. This is a complex issue which requires investment in communities. The police are over extended in their response to a large volume and assortment of calls. Federal agencies are partnering with local agencies to address crime. Legislation was introduced for more background checks which did not pass. There is a 44% rise in carjackings. The President hopes to address gun violence with legislation that will pass. Some pending legislation will address stronger gun storage, adding hidden serial numbers on guns, and purchasing of ghost gun purchases. .

President's Report: Schedules for CAPS and CLVN 2022 meetings will be March 8, May 10, July 12, Sept. 13 and Nov. 8. Marsalek attended a town hall crime forum sponsored by East Lake View Neighbors and a presentation by Sheriff Tom Dart on Electronic Home Monitoring. A recap of both meetings was sent to the membership. Marsalek will be meeting with other branch presidents on Jan. 12, 2022 to discuss crime and a neighborhood strategy. The 19th District has an Acting Commander and is in need of staff. The community was promised 400 staff for the District and we are down to less than 300 staff. The District Captain who is second in charge retired and no replacement has been named.

Treasurer's Report: Kink reported the treasury has just under \$17,000.00. Memberships have been coming in for 2022. There has been a decrease in membership over the years. We have lost several businesses to COVID. Marsalek reported a membership drive usually occurs in spring but this was not done due to Covid. Wilcox also commented that we have not been able to hold many of our social functions due to Covid. Poppy inquired if there is money for the stones to be fixed at Tubman School. There is \$1000.00 in the beautification fund and more money will be there after the flower sale. We also have general funds that can be used. Marsalek informed the group the executive board decided to wait until spring to fix the stones. Kink stated the total donation from the group was \$500.00 to the Lake View Food Pantry and this is a budgeted item.

CDDC Report: Diamond reported there was no meeting in December and the next meeting will be in February or March.

Planning & Zoning Committee Report: Poppy reported no activity.

Ald. Report: Catrell reported the ward will be offering N95 masks with a limit of one per person per household. The 46th Ward depleted their stock in one day. The masks are reusable and are not washable. They need to be replaced due to moisture. If any elderly or disabled members need shoveling they have a group of volunteers. Crime is a concern in the neighborhood. East Lake View Neighbors hosted a meeting and a second meeting is scheduled for Jan. 26. Sen. Feigenholtz hosted a meeting on Electronic Home Monitoring. CAPS REPORT 19th District - Beat 1933 (boundary - Belmont to Diversey between Lincoln to Halsted): The Community Policing meeting will be held on Jan. 11, 2022. The Commander is Amin Jessani and his contact information is amin.jessani@chicagopolice.org and the CAPS Sergeant is Arturo Hernandez. Commander Papaioannou has a new assignment as a Street Deputy. We thank him for his service to the District. The CAPS meeting was held on Zoom on Jan. 11, 2022. There were 15 burglaries since the last beat meeting-6 in November, 7 in January and 2 in January. The areas where the burglaries occurred were a construction site, 6 garages, 3 residences, 2 apartments and 1 business office. Bikes were taken and some buildings were broken into by breaking glass doors. The numbers for the robberies were 15 in November, 11 in December and 1 in January. Three juveniles were arrested for robbing a

business on the 3100 block of Clark as they were spotted in the area of Diversey and Mildred. Two robberies occurred on CTA red line property. There were 2 carjackings-one was a door dash driver in which the car was taken and recovered on 900 W. Hollywood. An individual inquired about coordination with private cameras and the police equipment. The SSA is a business tax on businesses in districts that uses some of those funds to finance private security. The next CAPS meeting will be March 8, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. on Zoom.
