

WHAT HAPPENED LAST MONTH MINUTES FROM MAY 9, 2023 MEETING

CLVN President, Diann Marsalek, called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. CLVN will be holding in person meetings for future meetings. Officers in attendance: Terry Diamond-Vice President, Mary Anderson-Corresponding Secretary, Jim Kink-Treasurer and Area Directors Dorothy Mroski, Dorothy Klees, Sharon Williams and Charley Wilcox. Excused officer was Sharon Williams. A quorum was present.

Zoning request for 3132-34 N. Kenmore for RT4 and rezone to RS3:

Rolando Acosta, attorney for the owner, made a presentation. This was not an agenda item so the presentation was informative for those in attendance. A presentation will be made at the July 11, 2023 meeting and this will be an agenda item. The owners want to build a single family home for themselves and three children on two lots. They also want space to work from their home. They are seeking an additional three feet in height with the building being 38 feet. The owners are seeking a zoning change from RS3 to R4 and would rezone after the permits are issued. The ground floor will be living space and the second floor with be where the bedrooms are located. The third floor will have a recreational room and an office. They also plan to have a swimming pool. The owners live in New York and want to live in Chicago to be close to other relatives who live in the area. Poppy reminded members the area was zoned in 1991 for R3 but there are some existing R4 and R5 properties. Suzanne Frank would like to see the area stay RS3 and does not feel the owner has demonstrated any hardship for the zoning change. An email was read from David Broz indicating he is not in support of the zoning request. Marsalek informed the group the first presentation would be at the July 11, 2023 meeting and the matter will be referred to the CLVN Planning and zoning committee. A second presentation would also be required before any vote.

President's Report: The 2023 CAPS and CLVN meetings will be meeting will be the second Tuesday of odd months-July 11, Sept. 12 and November 14. CAPS will meet at 6:30 p.m. and CLVN at 7 p.m. in person at Advocate in the Olson Auditorium. The CLVN Wine Tasting was very successful. It was well attended and thanks to Kirkwood for hosting. All funds raised will be applied to the neighborhood beautification fund which covers the cost to plant the corners. We will have a flower sale with orders due May 26, 2023 and pick up on June 2 and 3rd at Tubman School. Order forms are on the website. Thanks to the Cubs for donating tickets for game to CLVN neighbors. The summer movies will be Cars on June 16, Peter Pan July 9 and Aladdin on August 5 at dusk at Hawthorne School. Thanks to our sponsors.

Treasurer's Report: Kink reported the treasury holds \$19,300.00. The

wine tasting raised \$1172 for the beautification fund. We have 107 paid members. We will have expenditures on the movies but also getting sponsorships in for the movies. A donation was made to Nourishing Hope-formerly Lakeview Pantry which was approved at a past meeting. We might need to purchase directors and officer's insurance.

Beautification Report: Marsalek thanked Robin Greene for her help on the corners. We have received many compliments on the tulips. We will be planting the corners the first weekend of June. Planning & Zoning Committee Report: Marsalek reported there is no activity at this time.

Presentation by Senator Feigenholtz office: Samantha Biel informed us the legislative session will end May 19, 2023. The Senator is working on the state budget. She worked on bills to have area for electric cars to be charged and anti bullying with notification to the parents that their child is being bullied. A bill passed holding Uber and Lyft liable for accidents

Alderman's Report: No report.

LVCC Report: Klees reported the next meeting will be held in June.

Lake View East Chamber of Commerce: No report.

Tubman School: No one was aware of a new Principal being named at the school.

Chicago Cubs: No report.

unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 7:50 p.m. The next meeting is July 11, 2023.

The Community Policing meeting was held May 9, 2023 at 6:30 p.m. Burglaries, robberies and thefts are all done on our beat. Catalytic converters thefts are still occurring in the District. Bikes and packages are being stolen. Do not leave valuables in your car. There was a robbery pattern for 7-Eleven stores. Robberies occurred on the 3100 block of N. Clark and 1000 block of Wellington. A tip jar was taken from Starbuck's. This past week there was a 200 car caravan on the lakefront and resources were sent there. Complaints were raised about basketball playing and noise at Tubman school after the school closes. A member asked if there would be sufficient police presence after the Pride Parade. The police warned of traffic jams and congestion due to NASCAR downtown. The Commander met with the newly elected council.
